

But this is just what Sandra needs at the moment, and she reluctantly lets Bif drag her along to a community dance class, where gradually she starts finding her feet and romance as she meets her sister's friends. This is the perfect feel-good film.

The Goodfellas of figure skating films, I.Tonya is an absurd, irreverent, and piercing portrait of the life and career of Tonya Harding. Margot Robbie gives an amazing performance as the infamous ice skater, with Allison Janney (who took home a Golden Globe for this) as Harding's cruel and unfeeling mother.

When all the canine pets of Megasaki City are exiled to a vast garbagedump, Atari sets off alone in a miniature Junior-Turbo Prop and flies to Trash Island in search of his bodyguard-dog, Spots.

A riveting film about the world's first all-girl punk band, formed in London in 1976. Contemporaries of The Clash and The Sex Pistols, The Slits are the pioneering godmothers of punk.
